New partnerships with North Kalimantan and East Nusa Tenggara

In late 2017, INOVASI's Australia – Indonesia partnership was launched in both Sumba, East Nusa Tenggara (NTT) and North Kalimantan. The Sumba MoU signing took place on 2nd November at the Governor's Office in Kupang, NTT, between the NTT Governor Frans Lebu Raya, and the Head of the Research and Development Agency (Balitbang) Dr.Totok Suprayitno. The signing was witnessed by Michelle Lowe, Counsellor for Human Development from the Australian Embassy in Jakarta. Meanwhile, the North Kalimantan MoU signing took place in Jakarta on 12th December at the Ministry of Education and Culture, between the North Kalimantan Governor Dr.Irianto Lambrie and Dr.Totok Suprayitno. The signing was witnessed by Fleur Davies, Minister Counsellor of Governance and Human Development from the Australian Embassy in Jakarta.

Education Innovations in East Java

In East Java, INOVASI is adopting a different approach to other provinces. INOVASI will instead build on an education innovation stock-take study conducted in late 2017 and early 2018, which investigated over 180 individual initiatives across the entire province and identified 24 promising practices worthy of more detailed study. From these initiatives, INOVASI will jointly select the most promising for support in 2018. The stock take aims to document innovation and promising basic education practices, and understand in what context the innovations are successful and sustainable.

The documentation of the top six practices took place in December 2017, and results were shared at the co-hosted Jambore Inovasi forum in Surabaya on 4th December with KOMPAK, JawaPos and GIZ.

NTB Pilot Updates

The latter half of 2017 was a key period for INOVASI, with five pilots in planning and design phase across six NTB partner districts. From 13-14 February 2018, INOVASI stakeholders at the district and provincial level gathered in Mataram at a Dissemination Workshop to learn more about the findings and learnings from the pre-pilot phase. The pre-pilot is a small-scale program (e.g one class, a small number of schools or cluster), which is conducted over 3 months. Ideas and solutions are tested and tried out, prior to the full pilot design and implementation. Earlier in February, INOVASI also presented a pilot update from SETARA (children with learning disabilities) to central and regional stakeholders in Jakarta.
